We're very excited to welcome our three newest CrossWalk participants to the Dayspring family: Tommy Owens, Stevie Warnock, and Kelly Weisner.

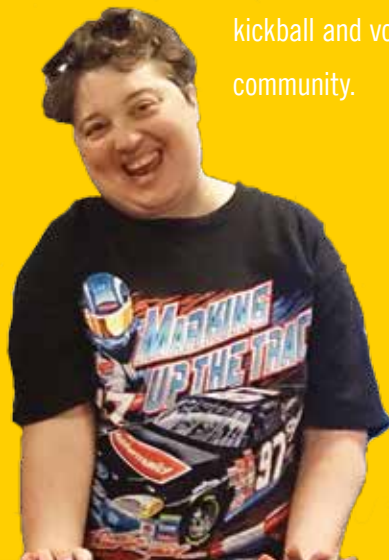
TOMMY enjoys spending time with family, watching Spongebob, socializing and working at the Lincoln Park Pool.
